
Cheerleading



How to make friends?





How to study in America?

ily. What I did for studying is that write key words on the poster and draw important things such as formula and DNA structure but it has to be colored because color must be easy to memorize and see clearly. Eventually, I posted it on my room's clothes chest and wall so that see it frequently. Especially I used to see it before I go to bed and before I leave for school.

Second is how to memorize vocab words. Many international students struggle to memorize vocab words. Honestly it is very hard to memorize vocab words. However I know some ways to memorize vocab easily. We cannot memorize vocab just in a one time. So what I did is using index cards. Let's say that I memorize 20 words. Write all words in front of the each index cards and write definition and two synonyms back side of card. And write each words, definition, synonyms 5 times at the paper to memorize. Later, check what you do not still memorized by index cards. It is going to be easy to memorize words.



Of course it is little bit difficult first time, but as times pass, it will be easy and realize how to study for school things such as tests quizzes and vocabs. Never give up whatever matter comes and just keep doing your best.
