# The Show Thirteen Reasons Why Challenges the Responsibility that Counselors Take



'Thir-The show called teen Reasons Why' has been watched by millions of teenagers and people all over the country. The new season has just been released three weeks ago. While delivering very controversial topics, the show has been very successful at conveying right message for troubled and suffering kids carefully. The original series and its subsequent second series provides a critical overview

of American High School culture. The central character is a seventeen year old high school student, Clay Jensen, and his deceased female friend Hannah Baker, who has committed suicide after failing to cope with the culture, gossip and lack of support from her friends and her school. A box of cassette tapes recorded by Hannah in the lead up to her suicide details thirteen reasons why she ended her life.


Since the show became hit, many issues arose. The show carefully speaks social issues related to teenagers and high school from drug addiction, abuses from home, gossips, bullyings, sexual assaults and ultimately to responsilities of adults such



as parents and school faculties to take care of children under their care. In the last episode of the first season, Hannah is sexually assualted by one of her classmate. She asks her guidance counselor for help. She failed to specifically mention that she had been raped by another student, however she indicated several times that she had intimate sexual relationship with another male student that was not consented.

Nevertheless, the guidance counselor was negligent and careless. He did not do further to resolve the case. He did not let her talk to female counselor although he knew that she was uncomfortable talking to him. He heard that she wanted to end her life, but he let her walk out his room. Consequently, she committed suicide on the same day.

Afterwards, many debates regarding the responsibility of guidance counselors to protect these kids and counsel with their problem correctly and safely arose. To hear right response, I decided to interview my guidance counselor, Mrs. Bonn. She



has been guidance counselor at my school for over thirty years. She has been my favorite teacher at the school and we have maintained very close relationship. She is retiring next year, thus I figured that it was perfect time to interview her with this question and get to know her better before she embarks.

She said counselors' responsibility is to help students to be safe. She said that her job gets really hard when students are hesitant

to tell her the truth, feeling afraid of being retaliated by telling on them. She said she praises those students who stand up and report the bullies and abuses that she or he was experiencing, because she is aware that



they are uncomfortable because they feel like they are afraid of losing relationship by telling about it and it takes lots of courage to share the story with another person. After watching the show, she said she did not understand the action of the counselor on the show. She said that it is mandatory to tell the supervisor, adminstrations, and involve parents immediately after hearing something like that – suicide attempt. She said she has to do that by law if she hears any kind of words assuming the report of abuse. She was angry at the action of him, and she said she would do anything she can do to protect students and never let them walk away without any solutions.


